

## 'Detroit: The City of Chefs III' to be Filmed at Black Star Farms in Suttons Bay

Black Star Farms in Suttons Bay will host a fall harvest dinner on Oct. 23 that will bring together some of Michigan's most iconic chefs. The dinner also will be filmed for "Detroit: The City of Chefs III."

The surrounding farms will be featured in the film as sources of produce for the dinner. The menu will focus on vegetarianism and Michigan's agricultural community.

To showcase Michigan's growing seasons, the film will feature chefs working closely with Michigan's farming community to better understand the significance of the term "farm to table."

The film also will explore why Detroit is leading the way nationally with urban farming. It also will provide a better understanding of why some people refer to food as "medicine."

The dinner is being spearheaded by Chefs Jimmy Schmidt, George Vutetakis, and Amber Poupore, along with several of Northern Michigan's chefs, and will feature coursed wine pairings from Black Star Farms.

Recently, Black Star Farms was awarded *USA Today's* "2025 Reader's Choice #1 Best Wine Country Inn.

In addition, the dinner will shed a light on, and be in support of, three charities — Project Feed the Kids, 5Loaves2FishNMI, and Leelanau Christian Neighbors.

This is the third installment in the Detroit PBS film series about Detroit's culinary heritage. "Detroit: The City of Chefs" was released in 2024 and was the recipient of the 2025 Michigan Emmy Award for "Best Historical Documentary."

"Detroit: The City of Chefs II" will debut on Oct. 24, 2025, on Detroit PBS.
